
THE BSSA IDEAL BUDGERIGAR MAIN FEATURES



<u>Length</u>: The BSSA Standard calls for a bird which has a minimum of 216mm measured from the top of the head to the tip of the tail. However, it recognizes that a budgerigar is essentially a bird of balance and this should always be taken into consideration. In other words, whilst a so called rare variety bird may well be 216mm, the modern day normal bird is often in excess of 240mm. Judges do not measure birds but our eye should be trained to visualize the dimensions, always ensuring that balance is maintained, regardless of the bird's actual length.
